Position Responsibilities

Performs technical work planning and conducting employee training and development programs for all divisions of the Emergency Services and Homeland Security Department which includes Emergency Medical Services, Emergency 911 and Emergency Management; does related work as required. Work is performed under the general supervision of the Assistant Director of Emergency Services and Homeland Security.

Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities

Knowledge of:

- Research, data analysis and report presentation techniques;
- Emergency medical care techniques and procedures;
- Advanced life support methods, procedures and equipment;
- Medical terminology;
- The methods, materials, practices, and techniques and equipment required for emergency medical treatment;
- The Incident Command System.

Ability to:

- Speak distinctly and deal with the public under stressful conditions and remain calm;
- Operate standard office, data entry and computer equipment;
- Train personnel effectively;
- Maintain training records and required training sources to maintain department required certifications as well as continuing education;
- Establish and maintain effective working relationships with associates and the general public.

Minimum Education and Experience Requirements

Associate degree with major coursework in Emergency Medical Services or Emergency Management with 5 years of experience in emergency services, Incident Action Plan and grant management; or, Bachelors degree in Emergency Medical Services or Emergency Management with 3 years experience in emergency services, Incident Action Plan and grant management.

Special Requirements

Must have NIMS Incident Command System (ICS) 100, 200 and 700 certifications; Emergency Management Institute Incident Systems (IS) 240,241 and 242 certifications; CPR certification; must be an instructor with the local community college, have a Paramedic Level I Instructor certification; and must obtain Emergency Medical Dispatching credentials within 24 months of employment.
